<b>Recognize reliable information sources</b>	I am aware that the information I collect must be reliable, must be adapted to my needs and reading level, and must bring me new useful information.	I can detect the reliability of common sources of data, information and their digital content. To assess the relevance of the information I collect, I consider a number of important elements such as the author.	I can critically assess the credibility and reliability of sources of data, information and digital content. I understand that the reliability of a content can be increased by a recommendation. I can recommend a content or author.
<b>EXAMPLES</b>	<p>When I find the contents that interest me on different sites, I discard those of the sites whose reliability I am not sure, keeping those found on portals whose validity is recognized: the site of the school, the library, a national or European institution, etc.</p> <p>When I see important news in social media, check if there are references to a source from which the news is taken.</p> <p>I know the difference between first-hand and second-hand sources and I can recognize them when I find them on the Internet.</p>	<p>I am able to determine if a site has reliable content by identifying the author, the sources, the date of publication, and the type of site. I can explain the reason why I have selected a website rather than another one when I conduct a research</p> <p>When I see important news in social media, I verify the source it is taken from and analyses the credibility of the source before trust it.</p> <p>I can identify the different types of sources and analyse on the basis of certain criteria if the second-hand sources I have found are true and reliable.</p>	<p>I can determine if a content is trustworthy by critically analysing it and cross-checking it with other sources on the Internet.</p> <p>When I see important news in social media, I triangulate: I look for three reliable sources that say the same thing before trust it.</p> <p>I can compare the different sources and analyse them critically, highlighting which are credible and which are not and providing explanations.</p>
